**Blended Intensive Programme (BIP)**  
***Mobility and migration through time 2024***

The theme of our 2024 program engenders an often lively, even confrontational discussion between people, political parties and states, particularly in Europe. In recent decades, so-called "economic" migrations have been joined by more cyclical and complex phenomena of mass mobilization following the various conflicts that have broken out around the world. We can also anticipate similar phenomena as consequences of climate change in the near future.

How can we understand this phenomenon scientifically? How can we debate it without falling into the trap of uninformed expressions of opinion, based more on primitive feelings than in-depth analysis? Can we discuss it, without repeating commonplaces that prevent us from hearing each other and making ourselves heard?

These questions are at the heart of the objectives of this project, which brings together European students from different countries and with different academic skills.

The question of mobility and migrations will be approached along several lines, which inform our program:

1. First and foremost, the aim is to bring together different thematic perspectives on the issue: we're bringing together students and researchers from the fields of history, economics, political science, sociology and journalism, who will be able to propose different angles of attack based on their disciplines and academic practices; also, reading and discussing a selected bibliography will enable us to build up a common base of information and knowledge during the online work, and to share it during the Lyon meeting, which will also provide other elements to be integrated into personal and collective reflection ;
2. We're also looking to vary the scale of our work: as well as tackling the issue on a global, macro scale, we're also looking to add a micro perspective, allowing us to take a closer look at the general issues and articulate them in specific cases-study; students will first work in "national" groups (during the first part of the program, in order to prepare a national presentation of the issue at the time of our meeting in Lyon), then in mixed groups to tackle other scales: local and European. Lyon and its region lend themselves well to a local, national and European approach, due to their nature as a major industrial center that has welcomed and continues to welcome significant mobility and various waves of migration over time, the characteristics of which have changed according to local, national and European policies on migration. Migratory phenomena have left their mark on the space, as well as on the formation of an important network of associations that will accompany us on our journey of (re)acquaintance;
3. The long-term nature of the migratory phenomenon also seems to us to be a priority: while the 20th and 21st centuries undoubtedly represent the quantitative explosion of the migratory phenomenon, it must be recognized that people have always moved according to trajectories that are both individual and collective, voluntary or forced. A brief review of history from antiquity to the present day, to follow the characteristics of the phenomenon over time, will enable us to put it into perspective, and no doubt provide a better understanding of the originality (or otherwise) of contemporary issues.
