1	Economics	Greek	English	<u>Greek A1</u> <u>English B2</u>	The language of instruction for the Department of Economics of University of Crete is Greek. In consequence language skills required for incoming ERASMUS student is Greek level A1. The English level required is B2. Students will write essays instead of attending courses and participate in the semester's exams.
2	Political Science	Greek	English	<u>English B2</u>	As most of the courses at the Department of Political Science are carried out in Greek, it is desired that the students speak and write in Greek. However the Department accepts students whose English knowledge is assessed to the B2 European Level, because the Department offers the alternative possibility to the Erasmus students of getting the necessary credits by writing an essay-paper in English.
3	Sociology	Greek	English	<u>English bachelor:B2</u> <u>master/phd:C2</u>	Certificate According to CEFR
4	Psychology	Greek	English	<u>English B2</u>	Although the language of instruction in the Department of Psychology is Greek, foreign students can be enrolled in courses following arrangements with our faculty members. We usually offer our international students the option to be evaluated either through a test in English (English literature is provided), the writing of an essay on the topics covered in the specific course, a presentation in English or a combination of the above.
5	Philosophy and Social Studies	Greek	English	<u>English B2</u>	As most of the courses are carried out in Greek, it is desired that the students speak and write in Greek. However the Department accepts students whose English knowledge is assessed to the B2 European Level, because the Department offers the alternative possibility to the Erasmus students of getting the necessary credits by writing an essay-paper in English.
6	History and Archaeology	Greek	English	<u>Greek A2</u> <u>English B1</u>	Although courses in the Department of History and Archaeology are taught in modern Greek, special classes in English may be offered for ERASMUS students. Incoming students who are not fluent in modern Greek are assigned a bibliography in English and are assessed in English (though an exam or through an extended essay). They are also encouraged to attend the Modern Greek Language Course for ERASMUS students (5 ECTS), in order to improve their speaking and writing skills in Greek. Some courses have been scheduled to be offered in English. ERASMUS students are advised to consult the list of courses available on the departmental website (http://www.history-archaeology.uoc.gr/) and to notify the departmental ERASMUS coordinator in advance.

7	Philology	Greek	English	<u>Greek A2</u> <u>English B1</u>	As a rule, courses in the Department of Philology are taught in Greek. Erasmus students are, therefore, advised to acquire speaking and writing skills in Greek; for this reason, the Modern Greek Language Course for Erasmus Students is compulsory (5 ECTS). In order to facilitate those Erasmus students who are not proficient in Greek, our department offers them the option to obtain the necessary credits for courses taught in Greek by writing the final exam, or essay, in English. Some courses are taught in English. Students are asked to consult the department's list of courses on the website (http://www.philology.uoc.gr/) for available courses and notify in advance the departmental coordinator.

9	Preschool Education	Greek	English	<u>English B2</u>	The Department of Preschool Education will not establish a separate corpus of modules in English to be offered to Erasmus students. However, each year a number of modules in English will be offered online. Students will be able to see what is available on the Erasmus link of the Departmental website. The details and data on each module (content of module, assignments, assessments etc.) will be available to Erasmus students through the students' web upon their registration.
